(ORLANDO)—Applying philosophy in the workplace is still in its infancy, but in April, StoicDan and four Humanistic leaders / professors published a groundbreaking article to help business leaders transform the workplace into a flourishing environment.

Since then, the article was peer-reviewed and accepted by <u>AOM2025</u>, the Academy of Management, who's 85<sup>th</sup> annual conference is hosted this year in Copenhagen, Denmark (starting July 25<sup>th</sup>). The conference will feature many world leaders in business management on hundreds of topics, and StoicDan will be presenting the topic of Humanistic leadership for the workplace.

The goal of practical philosophy is to go beyond teaching concepts and find ways to transform people and groups.

The article is roughly 33 pages long and 97 citations.
